SECTION 4 · FIRST AID MEASURES

FIRST AID PROCEDURES:

Eyes: Flush with running water as a precaution. Seek medical attention if irritation develops and persists.

Skin: Wash skin with soap and water. If irritation develops and persists seek medical attention.

Inhalation: For excessive inhalation remove to fresh air. If breathing is difficult seek medical attention.

Ingestion: Drink 2 glasses of water to dilute. Seek medical attention immediately.

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SECTION 5 - FIRE FIGHTING MEASURES

Extinguishing Media: Use water spray, alcohol-resistant foam, dry chemical or carbon dioxide.

Hazardous combustion products: Oxides of Borane and Boron

Fire Fighting Procedures: Cool fire-exposed containers with water spray to prevent container weakening and possible rupture. Use self-contained breathing apparatus with a full face piece operated in the positive pressure mode.

Unusual Fire and Explosion Hazards: None known or expected..

SECTION 6 - ACCIDENTAL RELEASE and DISPOSAL MEASURES

Small Spill: Use appropriate tools to put the spilled solid in a convenient waste disposal container. Finish cleaning by spreading water on the contaminated surface and dispose of according to local and regional authority requirements.

Large Spill: Use a shovel to put the material into a convenient waste disposal container. Finish cleaning by spreading water on the contaminated surface and allow to evacuate through the sanitary system.

SECTION 7 - STORAGE AND HANDLING

Handling: Avoid formation of dust and aerosols. Provide appropriate exhaust ventilation at places where dust is formed.

Storage: Keep container tightly closed in a dry and well-ventilated place. Moisture sensitive.

SECTION 8 - EXPOSURE CONTROLS AND PERSONAL PROTECTION

Engineering Controls: Use explosion-proof ventilation equipment. Provide adequate ventilation or other engineering controls to keep the airborne concentrations of dust, vapor or mists below the applicable workplace exposure limits indicated below. The level of protection and types of controls will vary depending upon potential exposure conditions.

Exposure Limits: Boric Acid Contains no substances with occupational exposure limit values.

Personal Protective Equipment (PPE):

Eyes: Eye Protection when pouring. Goggles or full-face shield are recommended.

Skin: Wear neoprene gloves, apron, and/or clothing. Viton gloves are recommended.

Clothing: Selection of protective clothing depends on potential exposure conditions and may include gloves, boots, suits and other protective items.

Respirators: Where adequate ventilation is not available an approved respirator must be worn. Respirator selection should be in accordance with the requirements of OSHA Respiratory Protection Standard, 29 CFR 1920.134. In confined areas, use a self-contained breathing apparatus.

Other Equipment: Eye wash station and shower in close proximity to use are advised.
